# **Pilgrimage for Life**

## **January 26-29, 2017**

### **CHAPERONE REQUIREMENTS**

Chaperones set an example for the young people who are participating in the **Pilgrimage for Life**. A chaperone is an adult, over the age of 21, charged with the responsibility for supervising young people throughout the trip. The following is what the West Deanery Youth Ministry **require** of Chaperones:

- An Archdiocesan Background check and Safe and Sacred training complete.
- Chaperone to youth ratio is no greater than 1 adult : 8 youth
- There is no toleration of the possession of or use of illegal drugs by any individual.
- There is no toleration of the possession of any weapons of any kind.
- Chaperones are expected to refrain from drinking alcoholic beverages for the duration of the trip, as well as during their travels to and from the trip.
- Chaperones are to use cellular phones with discretion. This just means that while your cell phone is very helpful in keeping in touch with other groups and/or the group leader, please focus on being attentive to your group of youth. Encourage the same from the youth!
- Chaperones are responsible for helping to enforce the Pilgrimage for Life and West Deanery Policies and Procedures and should use the Policies as a guide for their own behavior.
- All participants, including chaperones, are expected to attend all Pilgrimage activities. Chaperones should not leave planned activities unless there is an emergency and/or contact has first been made with Tom Steiner. Please contact Tom Steiner in case of all emergencies. Adults are not to leave to go to cocktail lounges, bars, restaurants, etc.
- Chaperones are responsible for enforcing curfew and for keeping noise to a minimum in the sleeping areas. All youth participants are expected to be quiet, when it is determined "Lights Out" time.
- Chaperones should check that their youth are acting in a mature & respectful manner at all times especially times of prayer, presentations (particularly at museums), Mass, and in the sleeping areas.
- Chaperones should attempt to foster good and healthy discussion with their youth throughout the trip to reinforce the sites visited, presentations seen and prayers offered.
